9. LIVERPOOL (England)

- **MERSEYSIDE**, 1858, 22 Roscommon St: **H.M. STANLEY LIVING PLACE** • He worked in a London Road's haberdashery; became a butcher delivery boy in Bramley Moore Dock • **Captain David Harding** of the Windermere ship signed him as a cabin boy • Feb 1859: he landed in New Orleans, worked for Henry Hope Stanley and adopted his name • Stanley naturalised American in 1885
- **ELDER DEMPSTER LINES** shipping Cie: Carried Leopold II's supplies for & from Congo & Congo/Africa Institute students to & from COLWYN BAY
- **LIVERPOOL Philharmonic HALL**, Mar 23, 1904: LAUNCH of the Congo Reform Association by Ed. Dene Morel & Dr. H. G. Guinness
- **HATTON & COOKSON** shipping Cie, Aug. 7, 1877: RELIEVED Stanley's trans-Africa expedition after receiving his letter of Aug. 4, 1877: "To any gentleman who speaks English at Emboma" • The expedition reached Boma on Aug 9, 1877, 1001 days after leaving Zanzibar on Nov 12, 1874
- **LIVERPOOL & North Wales Steam-Ship Cie**, Sep 1885: transferred W. Hughes, Kanza & Kinkasa on a vessel from Liverpool to Llandudno
- **INTERNATIONAL SLAVERY MUSEUM** Patrice LUMUMBA portrait on the Black Achievers Wall

- 5. BELFAST, 50 Gloucester St: **J.B. DUNLOP LIVING PLACE** • **BLUE PLAQUE**: 38-42 May St; invention place of the PNEUMATIC TYRE

REP. OF IRELAND

- 6. DUBLIN • SANDYCOVE, Sep 1, 1864: **Roger David CASEMENT's BIRTHPLACE** • 1903: British 1st CONSUL in the Congo; reported on Leopold II's atrocities & he sponsored MOREL's Congo Reform Association • GLASNEVIN Cemetery: **CASEMENT's GRAVE** (+ Aug 3, 1916) • DEANS GRANGE Cemetery: **DUNLOP's GRAVE** (+ Oct 23, 1921) • The Irish United Nations Veterans Association, **IUNVA HOUSE**, Mount Temple Rd: Irish **BLUE HELMETS** served in the Congo (Jul 28, 1960-Jun 30, 1964) • 67 Upper Stephen St: Dublin 2: 1st pneumatic tyre factory - **BLACK PLAQUE**



WALES

- 7. St ASAPH, Feb 20, 1847– May 13, 1856: H.M. Stanley (John Rowlands) placed at the St. ASAPH'S Poor law Union Workhouse (Former H.M. Stanley's Hospital)
- 8. COLWYN BAY, 1890-1912: CONGO & AFRICAN TRAINING INSTITUTE OF WALES • Old Cemetery: **Rev. W. HUGHES**, his wife, children & **CONGO BOYS' GRAVES**
- RHOSLAN (near Llanystumdwy), Apr 8, 1856: Rev. W. Hughes' BIRTHPLACE
- LLANELIAN: Rev. Hughes' sister house; he lived with the boys; 1888: the village grocers' shop was named the 'CONGO HOUSE'



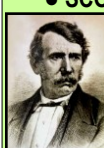
10. HAWARDEN: Edmund Dene MOREL'S LIVING PLACE

- 11. BANGOR University: Congo & African Institute ARCHIVES
- 12. CAERNARFON, Jun 15, 1891: H.M. STANLEY's fundraising LECTURE for the Congo Institute attended by 4,000 persons
- 13. LLANGOLLEN: Rev. William HUGHES married Katie (Baptist Bethel Chapel) • They moved into their first home, Tudor House, with the Congo Boys
- 14. DENBIGH, Jun 22, 1846: **H.M. STANLEY's BIRTHPLACE** (born John Rowlands); Feb 18, 1847: baptised at St. Hilary's Church • Mar 17, 2011: unveiling of **Henry Morton STANLEY's first STATUE**
- 15. ABERHOSAN: Dec 5, 1887: Rev. Hughes lectured & Nkanza sang in Welsh, English & Congolese languages
- 16. LLANSTEPHEN, 1901: DEATH PLACE & GRAVE of Sir Francis Walter de WINTON (H.M. Stanley's doctor & the Congo Free State 1st administrator).
- 17. SWANSEA: The COPPER INDUSTRY shared resources & expertise with the Zambian (North Rhodesia) & DR Congo (Katanga, UMHK) copper belt.
- 18. NEAH: TENNANT CANAL built by Charles TENNANT, the father of Dorothy (Tennant) STANLEY, Henry Morton Stanley's wife.

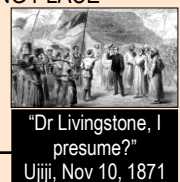
- 1. GLASGOW, 1836: Dr David LIVINGSTONE studied medicine at Anderson's University
- **SCOTTISH FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION/MUSEUM**: archives of the Jun 14, 1974's Scotland Vs. Zaire (DRC) World Cup match (2-0)
- 2. BLANTYRE, Mar 19, 1813: **Dr LIVINGSTONE's BIRTHPLACE**
- 3. EDINBURGH, May 22, 1859, Picardy Place: **Arthur Conan Doyle's BIRTHPLACE** studied at the University of Edinburgh • Jun 14-23, Protestant Missionary Conference recognised the biggest missionary field in the world
- 4. DREGHORN, J.B. DUNLOP 1910: World the (Belgian) Congo as the Feb 5, 1840: **John Boyd**

ENGLAND

- 19. BRADFORD, May 14, 1891: H.M. STANLEY LECTURED at St George's Hall and stayed with his wife Dorothy at Midland Hotel
- 20. BOLTON, 16 Wood Street, Sep. 19, 1851: BIRTHPLACE of William H. LEVER (+ May 7, 1925), founder of the **UNILEVER**; exploited palm oil in Congo since 1911
- 21. MANCHESTER, Oct 21st 1884: H.M. STANLEY's speech in the large Room of the Town Hall, Albert Square, for the Manchester Chamber of Commerce
- 22. BIRMINGHAM: William CADBURY, Quaker chocolate millionaire & co-founder of the Congo Reform Association (Edgbaston, Feb. 17, 1867: BIRTHPLACE; Bromsgrove July 8, 1957: DEATHPLACE).
- 23. NOTTINGHAM, Newstead Abbey, June 1874: **Livingstone's disciples James CHUMA & Abdullah SUSA meeting** Horace Waller, Agnes & Tom Livingstone
- 24. PITSFORD, 1835: BIRTHPLACE of Sir Francis Walter de WINTON, Congo Free State 1st Administrator; he proclaimed it at Vivi (1st Congo capital) on July 1st 1885.
- 25. OXFORD: Daphne PARK, Baroness of Monmouth (Sep 1, 1921–Mar 24, 2010), principal of Somerville College & former MI6 officer in Congo (1959-1961); she could said had also her LUMUMBA's assassination plan; Wantage: John Hobbs HARRIS's birthplace (Jul 29, 1874).
- 26. BATH: Sep 15, 1864, British Association for the Advancement of the Science's preliminary Nile source debate meeting at the Mineral Water Hospital between R. BURTON & J. SPEKE • A BRONZE PLAQUE for Dr LIVINGSTONE who stayed at 13, the Circus, Sep 1864.
- 27. NESTON Park (Wiltshire), Sep 15, 1864: John SPEKE's DEATH PLACE
- 28. TORQUAY (Devon), Mar 19, 1821: Richard BURTON's BIRTHPLACE
- 29. BUCKLAND BREWER, (Devon), May 4, 1827: John H. SPEKE's BIRTHPLACE
- 30. SANCREED (St Buryan, Cornwall), Aug 21, 1849: **BIRTHPLACE of Rev. George GRENFELL**; explorer and missionary (+ Jul 1, 1906 & buried in Basoko, DR Congo)
- 31. RADIPOLE (Weymouth), Jul 1, 1844: **Verney Lovett CAMERON's BIRTHPLACE**
- 32. LEIGHTON BUZZARD (Bedfordshire), Mar 27, 1894: CAMERON's DEATH PLACE
- 33. SHOREHAM (Kent), St. Peter & Paul churchyard: **Verney L. CAMERON's RESTING PLACE**
- 34. DOWLISH WAKE (Somerset): John H. SPEKE's RESTING PLACE
- 35. SOUTHAMPTON: Apr 15, 1874, LIVINGSTONE's body landed from Africa
- 37. BISHOPSBORNE: Joseph CONRAD's LIVING PLACE
- 38. CANTERBURY cemetery: **Joseph CONRAD's RESTING PLACE**
- 39. BROOKWOOD (Surrey): **H.M. STANLEY's PICTURES** in village's archives.
- 40. CROWBOROUGH (Sussex), Jul 7, 1930: A. Conan DOYLE's DEATH place
- 43. FROME (Somerset): Alice Seeley HARRIS birthplace (1870) & her husband Sir John Hobbs HARRIS death place (Apr 04, 1940); missionaries in Congo; she pictured King Leopold II's Congo atrocities & they campaigned against the slavery & the colonisation; they joined E.D. Morel's CRA.
- 44. DOVER (Kent): Henry Morton STANLEY landing and boarding from/to Africa, Paris & Brussels.

41. STROOD (Medway)

Birthplace of Stanley 1st trans-Africa expedition's assistants: Edward & Francis POCOCK • Rochester's Guildhall Museum: **ART SOUVENIRS (tribal axe & club)** sent by Stanley to their father - A memorial for them at UPNOR Church



42. PIRBRIGHT (Surrey)

St. Michael & All Angels churchyard: **GRAVE of Sir Henry Morton STANLEY (BULA MATARI - The Rocks Breaker)** & his wife Dorothy (+ Oct 5, 1926) • Furzehill Estate: H. M. STANLEY's official mansion & living house at Stanley Hill



36. LONDON (England)

- British & Foreign Medical School, the Aldersgate St Dispensary, Charing Cross Hospital & Moorfields Hospital where Dr D. LIVINGSTONE completed his medicine studies
- Golders Green CREMATORIUM, **Edmund Dene morel's RESTING PLACE**
- Lambeth North, 1895-1900: Sir H.M. STANLEY served one term as the Liberal Unionist Member of Parliament (Re-naturalised British in 1892 & knighted in 1899)
- Langham Hotel: H. M. STANLEY stayed in before going in search of Livingstone in Africa
- Kensington Gardens: **Dedicated OBELISK to John Hanning SPEKE**, the first European who explored and fixed the source of the Nile problem.
- Mortlake, South West London: **Richard BURTON's TOMB**
- Royal Geographical Society (RGS): **STATUE OF LIVINGSTONE** outside the RGS • Dr Livingstone, H.M. Stanley, Rev. W. Hughes, Bombay Africans & the Congo explorers ARCHIVES & PORTRAITS • The carved section of the TREE BARK where LIVINGSTONE's heart & organs were buried beneath in a tin box.
- Royal Albert Hall: May 5, 1890 – H.M. STANLEY lectured for the RGS • Nov 19, 1909: **CONGO REFORM ASSOCIATION's** anti-Leopold II DEMONSTRATION for the Congolese people
- South Norwood, Montague Place: **Arthur Conan Doyle's LIVING PLACE**
- The Joseph Conrad Society: 238-246 King St, London, W6 ORF
- Twickenham Museum, Teddington Riverside, 1875: J. A. Messenger built, to Stanley's specification, the ten-oared & five-sectioned Stanley's boat he named the **LADY ALICE**
- Westminster Palace Hotel, 16.06.1913: Last Congo Reform Association meeting
- Wandsworth, 1873: Stanley schooled in the Rev. Conder's Wandsworth School, the boy Ndugu M'Hali **KALULU** (+ Mar 28, 1877, Kalulu Falls/Lualaba, DRC)
- Canon Street Hotel: Nov 7, 1884, Henry Morton STANLEY lectured on the Congo River country at London Chamber of Commerce.
- Westminster Cathedral/Abbey, Apr 18, 1874: Dr Livingstone's FUNERAL & GRAVE • Jul 12, 1890: H.M. STANLEY & DOROTHY religious marriage's venue
- Whitehall, 2 Richmond Terrace, Westminster, SW1, **BLUE PLAQUE**: Sir Henry Morton STANLEY LIVING & DEATH PLACE (May 10, 1904).
